Job purpose

- 1. To manage a caseload of children and their families, promoting effective support tailored to individual need
- 2. To foster and develop working relationships with families, school staff and other professionals
- 3. To work as part of a multi-disciplinary team to ensure consistency of high-quality service delivery

Main duties

Service Delivery

- 1. Be confident delivering 1-to-1 therapeutic support to children and young people aged 4-13.
- 2. Be empathetic and responsive to the needs of individual children
- 3. Maintain appropriate confidentiality with regards to children and their families
- 4. Respond to Child Protection matters as necessary
- 5. Recognise and maintain appropriate professional boundaries
- 6. To be able to build and maintain effective professional relationships with individual families and other agencies that work with them

Professional Knowledge, Internal Processes and Systems

1. To use a range of therapeutic techniques to provide a bespoke support package to children and young people referred to the service



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- 2. to maintain effective case notes
- 3. Use agreed outcome tools and measurements to evidence impact of work with children and their families.
- 4. To meet reporting requirements of The Benjamin Foundation, Ormiston Families and commissioners as required
- 5. To have a good understanding of safeguarding legislation and procedures

Communication

- 1. Through discussion with the child, and with information gathered from the referrer and family if appropriate, to come to an agreed understanding of the issues and the possible actions that could be taken to resolve issues and offer support
- 2. To act in the best interests of the child or young person at all times
- 3. To plan a series of actions that should lead to the desired outcomes for that child/young person. This individual support programme will be discussed with the child and with the referrer and family where appropriate
- 4. To inform, advise, support, mentor and advocate with the aim of delivering the agreed individual support programme
- 5. To develop and deliver a range of support packages for individual children and young people
- 6. To be aware of the sensitivities and challenges that working in a range of settings demands and to make sure professional boundaries, health and safety and necessary risk assessments are maintained and implemented at all times
- 7. To contribute to the development of The Benjamin Foundation and the Supporting Smiles Service including attending Supervisions, Team Meetings and relevant training.

General

- 1. To maintain key relationships to high standards at all times
- 2. To attend and report to relevant meetings both within and beyond The Benjamin Foundation
- 3. To undertake personal development and attend Personal Reviews and any relevant training
- 4. To undertake such other duties as may be delegated or assigned commensurate with the level of grading and role of the post
- 5. To adhere to the organisations Health & Safety Policies and Procedures
